A Message from the Board

Dear Neighbors,

The days are getting shorter, and soon school will be back in session! Fall is around the corner, and so are some interesting changes for the Grove.

As you hopefully read in previous newsletters, Centex (the Grove's developer) plans to complete its responsibilities to Fairfax County in 2007 (see bond release article on page 2). One of the most tangible results of this will be that traffic gates will be installed in the community (see page 5), eliminating cut-through traffic between Route 1 and the neighborhood to the north of us. Centex has informed us that they plan to install these gates in late October.

Because there has been mixed reaction to the gates, the HOA will be conducting a homeowner survey to determine if people want to petition the county for the gates' removal. Please watch for a mailing about this very important issue.

The Board is also thinking about the Annual Meeting, which will occur in early December (more information will be mailed to you as the date approaches). The Board is currently one member short, and two more positions will expire at the end of the year. Please consider running for a Board position—our community needs volunteers! Feel free to contact any of the Board members named at left or email questions to board@gathm.com.

If serving on the Board is too much of a time commitment, please consider serving on a committee. The Social Committee plans all our wonderful events; the Budget and Finance Committee ensures we can pay for them; and the Communications Committee makes sure homeowners know about events happening in the community. But don't forget about the Parking and Safety and Landscape and Pool Committees, which ensure we have a safe and beautiful community (respectively) as well. The neighborhood runs on the time and effort of volunteers, so please consider pitching in where you can.

The Social Committee has planned another wonderful block party for us this year. There are details inside, so mark your calendars! Hope to see you there and enjoy the rest of the summer!

Bond Release...Huh??

You may have heard the phrase "bond release" from one of your neighbors and wondered what it meant. As with any developer in this county, Centex Homes was required to develop a specific and detailed plan that included every detail of the neighborhood, including the layout of streets, sidewalks, common areas, placement of trees, etc. This plan, long before the first shovel hit dirt, was presented to Fairfax County. The County reviewed it, making sure it met all the County's requirements, and it was revised, as necessary. Upon approval, both parties signed the plan, meaning that Centex agreed to deliver every detail of that plan. As an incentive, the County is holding a certain amount of Centex's money - a bond - until everything that was mutually agreed is done. Once that happens, Centex's bond will be released. Their money will be returned to them; and any and all of their obligations to this community are fulfilled. This will signal the end of any relationship between the community and Centex.

Back to those specific deliverables - what about those dead trees, are they part of the plan? Actually, yes, they

are. Centex has marked dead trees with a red/white striped tape (some of you may have noticed these in your yard). These are the trees that Centex will replace, a one-time replacement, as part of fulfilling their part of the plan agreement with the County. Please note that Centex is not required to replace a three year old tree with another tree that age. It will likely be replaced with a young tree, one that will be much smaller than what you may have been accustomed to seeing.

As you can see, this is a critical issue for our community and one that your HOA Board has monitored closely from the beginning. To ensure that the community's interests are met as per plan, the Board is hiring an engineer to serve as our advocate through this process. The engineer, working closely with the HOA board and Cardinal Management, will ensure that Centex fulfills its obligations.

Stay tuned for additional updates, or attend a monthly HOA Board meeting and ask a question. We'd love to see you there. See page 6 for dates and location.

News at the Pool

The pool will be open through Labor Day and for one additional day, September 8, from 12 to 4 pm, for our block party.

Looking ahead to next summer, we will be soliciting offers from multiple pool contractors to determine the best contract. In response to homeowners' requests, we will be seeking proposals that will enable the pool to be open 7 days a week for the summer, rather than the current 6 day week. Other suggestions? Get Ready, Gates Coming to Lindberg

As the earliest residents in our community know, gates will be installed on Cyrene and Grey Goose where they intersect with Lindberg. For those new to our community, this is part of the original community plan, signed off by the developer, Centex Homes, and approved by Fairfax County. While earlier updates reported this was a Fairfax County requirement, the requirement that the plan include these gates was a response to concerns by the surrounding communities of increased car traffic on their neighborhood streets.

Once installed, the gates at the two intersections with Lindberg will remain in the closed position, preventing car traffic. Pedestrian traffic will not be impeded. Emergency vehicle access will not be affected.

Centex has informed us that they plan to install these gates in late October.

Trash and Recycling

Collection Times: Trash is collected on Monday and Thursday. Recycling is picked up on Monday, along with your trash. For pickups on holidays, you can call the number on your trash container the night before for a recorded message telling you whether or not trash will be collected on the holiday.

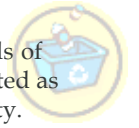
Please be responsible for your recycling on windy days and make sure all recycling stays in the bin.

You may have noticed that the HOA has installed trash cans around the Grove. Pitch in to help keep our community clean by picking up trash you see on the ground and tossing it in one of the new trash cans.

Trash and/or recycling bins should be placed curb-side after 6:00 pm Sunday and Wednesday and should be retrieved from the curbside by dusk on the day of collection. Please do not place your trash or recyclables out more than one day prior to pickup. Your neighbors will appreciate not having to see your garbage!



Recycling: Only certain kinds of plastics and paper are accepted as recyclables in Fairfax County.



Here's a sample of what's recyclable and what's not. For the complete list, visit <http://www.fairfaxcounty.gov/dpwes/recycling/residential.htm>.

What's recyclable? Glass containers; metal food and beverage containers; plastic containers only if they have a neck; plastic soda bottles and cans; newspapers; magazines; paper; flattened cereal and cracker boxes; and flattened cardboard.

What's Not? Pizza boxes; plastic bags; foam take-out containers; yogurt and dairy tubs; and container or jar lids, caps, and tops.

Please be aware that all recyclables must be **in the bin**. Large cartons, even if they are flattened, are left for the regular trash pickup unless they are in your recycling bin.

Do you have a computer, printer, copier, fax, telephone or television that you want to recycle? Please visit <http://www.fairfaxcounty.gov/dpwes/recycling/mat-comp.htm> for a list of organizations that will accept your old electronics.

Before you dig, get to know Miss Utility

After receiving the appropriate approval from the HOA and before your dig, please call 811 at least 3 working days *before* you or a contractor dig in your yard. When planning any kind of construction, home improvement, or landscaping—no matter how large or small the project is—call Miss Utility at 811 to have underground utility lines located before beginning any digging. Your call to Miss Utility is routed to the local “one call center” in your area. The Miss Utility center notifies utilities of the upcoming excavation work so they can locate and mark their underground utility lines in advance to prevent possible damage to underground utility lines, injury, property damage and service outages. *This service is free.*



The “Miss Utility Law” (Virginia Underground Utility Damage Prevention Act) requires that Miss Utility be called at least 3 working days in advance of the planned work to allow time for marking, that the marks be respected and protected, and that excavation be completed carefully. References to “working day” means every day, except Saturdays, Sundays, and legal state and national holidays.
